Gary McEnery, director of the neighborhood garden was featured as a workshop presenter at the Penn State Master Gardeners' Spring Workshop at the Erie Art Museum. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN PROGRAMS?

The **Ophelia Project** has made an impression at the SSJNN. In the fall of 2010 and the winter and spring of 2011, our children have learned about S.T.A.R.S (self esteem, teamwork, attitude and respect) Qualified teachers have worked with our 1st, 2nd and 3rd graders over five weekly sessions. Our middle grade boys were introduced to Boy Talk, another program from Ophelia, and our middle grade girls experienced Girl Talk.
