



13 facade improvement projects were completed in Little Italy on 6 businesses and 7 residences, totaling \$74,449.25. \$50,000 of those face-lifts were funded by generous SSJNN tax credit donors.

Implementation of the Federal Byrne Criminal Justice Grant began in Little Italy. Some of its components include increased code enforcement, police presence (via foot, bicycle & a mobile precinct unit), surveillance, a youth outreach worker, and collaboration with other organizations, businesses and residents.





teens from Little Italy worked and learned in the gardens this year, and 2 of them sold produce at the farmers' market. 10 *farmers* participated in the market, now in its fifth year. It continues to grow each year and more than \$5,000 SNAP. WIC and Senior vouchers were redeemed and matched this season as incentives for neighbors to ourchase fresh and healthy food.

34 people received affordable housing and participated in the Genesis home ownership program that includes mentoring in budgeting, home maintenance and much more.



SSJNN served 311 unduplicated youth last year in individualized and small group programs, including: art, basketball, chorus, cooking, folk art, gardening, tutoring, mentoring, Pedal Mettle (earn-a-bike), sewing and story time.

Urban art was installed. including bike racks, a mural and "Step Into Poetry" (poetry on the stairs). The poetry project, directed by Sr. Mary Lou Kownacki, OSB, was funded in part by Erie Arts & Culture, the Sisters of St. Joseph Neighborhood Network and an anonymous donor. Artist Joe Gallagher illustrated the poems on the east side.





SSINN now has 4 eautiful and thriving community gardens, plus one urban orchard. ore than 60 *neighbors* grew produce in the gardens this year, and countless more individuals and groups and enjoyed their beauty, bounty and place for education and congregation.



12 large neighborhood cleanup events were completed. In the Eastside Multicultural Community more than 15 tons of illegally dumped items were removed. Some of the areas focused on were alleyways, complete parcels, properties of elderly residents and main traffic corridors.
