Activities for Youth



Outdoor activities such as art in the park and a movie night provided children with COVIDsafe activities to socialize and express themselves. Bike Programs

We distributed a tremendous total of 226 bikes this year! We typically average

around 80 bikes per year, but our faithful staff and bike volunteers met the needs of our community on a new level. These bikes serve as a lifeline for our neighbors, many of whom are New Americans and without transportation. Each donated bikes requires around 8-12 hours to be sufficiently repaired, taking our total bike volunteer hours to 1,205!


Little Italy Farmers Market



Housing and Home Ownership

Our staff, community partners, and **volunteers** completed the renovations on 5 affordable housing units and began work on an additional 3 units. We worked together with Erie DAWN to remodel a single-family home for their rapid rehousing program. Another key partnership with the Maleno Family-to-Family Fund helped a neighborhood family with essential home repairs. And best of all, one family from the Genesis program graduated and purchased their first home!



Neighborhood Revitalization

We completed a total of 16 home and facade improvement projects with partners like Europa Delicatessen on Federal Hill and Odessa's Place in Little Italy. We reconnected with neighbors through 30 community painting sessions to complete the stunning new mural on Odessa's Place, led and designed by artist and educator Dr. Natalia Pilato. Also, we assisted 4 local businesses and non-profits in installing security camera systems and planted dozens of trees on Parade Street.





Grants, corporate contributions, private gifts from generous donors, in-kind donations, and 4,582 hours contributed by more than 200 volunteers helped us to rebuild and reconnect.
