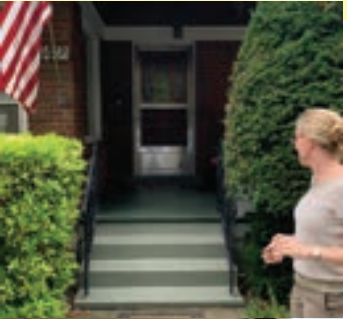


On the cover: 10 Years of the Little Italy Farmers Market

The 10th year of the Little Italy Farmers Market kicked off on June 26, 2023. What began with a passion, our teen workers, and a few local farmers grew immensely in the past decade. The mission stays rooted in providing healthy, affordable, and local produce to the people of Erie as well as bringing our neighbors together.

Supporting Women-Led Households

After completing regular surveying of our neighbors in the summer of 2022, we discovered that 70% of folks we served live in women-led households at or below the poverty line. Thanks to a first-time investment from the Erie Women’s Fund Furchak-Ferko Grant Program, we launched a home repair mini-grant initiative for these neighbors. Open to both renters and homeowners, the results of these small grants were transformational.



Building Bike Culture in Erie

This year, we continued momentum and distributed 215 bicycles, mainly to refugee and New American families. As the program continues to evolve, we aim to promote alternative transportation, green infrastructure, and quality of life in Erie through biking. Youth enjoyed a beautiful bike trip as part of our Trips For Kids chapter work to Presque Isle.

SSJNN embarked on a new six-year cycle of funding with our tax credit partners through the PA DCED Neighborhood Partnership Program (NPP). A joyful event in Little Italy was held in May of 2023 with partner Highmark Health and their subsidiary United Concordia Dental. Together, we honored Bhutanese refugees Anil and Dirpa Pradhan, who graduated from the NPP-funded Genesis Home buying Program in 2020. We are grateful for Highmark Health and United Concordia Dental, as well as Marquette Bank for their new, 6-year NPP commitment. Ford Friendship Van Donation

Persistence pays off! In our eighth year of applying, SSJNN was selected by Erie Ford dealers to receive a new 2022 Ford Transit Van. Our staff and dedicated volunteers for our first 22 years have used their own personal vehicles for all kinds of essential activities to support the community gardens, soup kitchen, youth programming, and more. This is a wonderful step forward for the organization.



Small Business Program Launch

With the support of Erie County Gaming Revenue Authority (ECGRA), we launched a new program to provide capacity building and technical assistance to small businesses and entrepreneurs in our footprint. Small business development specialists, Paramount Pursuits, Inc., have served as a great partner to provide direct coaching to the eight businesses within our service area, including Enrique's Southeast Mexican Taqueria and Tortilleria, who hosted the public announcement (below). A first in the community, this small business partnership program is offered in both English and Spanish.



Youth Travel Club

At the beginning of 2023, Youth Program Coordinator Connor Herron took advantage of our new van and launched SSJNN's first youth travel club. Youth involved in any program were invited to join and it was an immediate success. Some of the first trips included the playground at Presque Isle, an educational workshop at Lake Erie Arboretum at Frontier, and an art lesson at Erie Clay Space.

This includes extensive education about urban agriculture but also many other critical skills like maintenance, personal growth, and customer service, all taught and mentored by our outstanding garden coach volunteers.



Financial Appeal

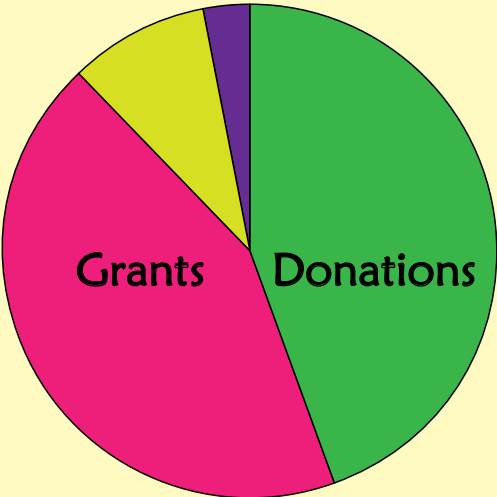

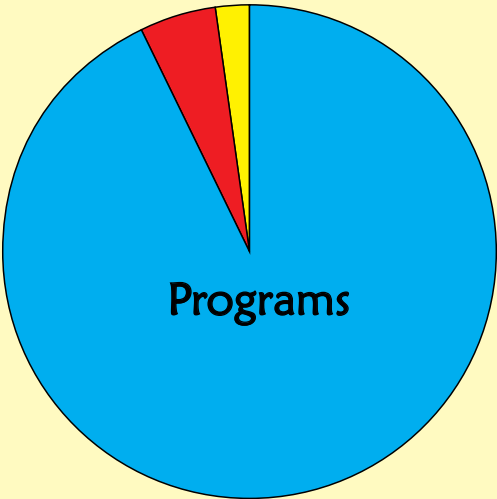

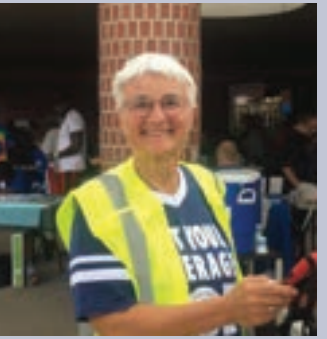
